Emergency Response Information Kit (ERIK)

An Emergency Response Information Kit (E.R.I.K) can assist emergency responders in situations where a patient may not be able to communicate their conditions, medical history or allergies. It provides essential information so responders can provide the correct care in an emergency medical situation.

Once completed, the kit should be placed on your fridge door, where emergency crews have been trained to look for it, ensuring it is readily available if needed.

You can pick up an E.R.I.K. at the Centre's reception or by connecting with a <u>local senior resource council</u>.




Charleswood Library Internet Basics
