

Dan Paccioretti, a graduate from San Francisco State University with a Master's in Communication Disorders, has more than 40 years' experience as an audiologist, educator, and researcher. Now in semi-retirement he has worked in hospitals, public health clinics, education, and the hearing aid manufacturing industry. Dan has provided hearing health care related services, and developed programs, for deaf and hard of hearing

individuals of all ages, with a special focus on school-aged children and

older adults. He has conducted and published research and in 2021 was a Research Audiologist for a study looking at older adults' ability to benefit from advanced hearing technology in noisy environments. Dan participated in the development of the World Health Organization's (WHO) "Assistive product specifications and how to use them" guide published in 2021, with contributions to the sections on hearing aids and FM systems. Dan is an active member of Speech and Hearing BC and Speech and Audiology Canada (SAC).



### A few funnies for your enjoyment


